








With the confirmation of a positive case of COVID-19 this week, questions have arisen about how we determine a close contact when a student or staff member has tested positive for COVID-19. We determine these contacts with the help of the Hamilton County Public Health official assigned to OLG. The following information is taken from the Hamilton County School Reference Guide for COVID-19, and it explains the process we use to determine close contacts.

CLOSE CONTACTS



Avoid close contact

A close contact is any individual (e.g., students or staff members) that has been within six feet of a case of COVID-19 for 15 minutes or more during the infectious period.

Identifying close contacts begins 48 hours before the onset of symptoms or 48 hours before the date of the COVID-19 test if the individual never developed symptoms of COVID-19. These close contacts will include students and staff members with or without face coverings.

Hamilton County Public Health's COVID-19 Outbreak Response Team and the Point of Contact at the school will work together to

determine who will be considered a close contact.

Reporting Dates: August 20-October 4 Our Lady of Grace has had 1 positive case.

COVID-19 and Spiritual Life: Living one day at a time

If you have been reading my weekly column. You know that I comment from time to time on life with COVID and how it impacts our spirituality. During this COVID-19 pandemic, all of us have been lifted into a new way of living our day. Many of us who were so busy before have been slowed by an extremely small organism with a huge amount of power. As we work to figure out how to reorganize our lives, each day presents a new set of rules and changes that may give us a reason to pause and think. Many of us are experiencing more uncertainty and a feeling of being out of control.

And yet, each day is unique – and there are still are so many blessings in each one, like the sun rising, birds singing, the birth of a new baby and the beautiful fall colors and crisp autumn days we are experiencing right now. I see people who are helping people. I know many who are reintroducing themselves to the most precious unit of family. Others are talking to people they have not visited in months.

If you choose to, you could call it a rebirth or renewal. It is a new chance to slow ourselves down. These times have given many of us a different lens with which to see the world and realize that each day is precious. Time that was once taken for granted now is seriously reconsidered. There now are rules and cautions that affect us all.

One way to forge ahead with a clearer mental capacity is to focus on the current day ahead — not on all of the days to come. Viewing our time as a single day gives us a chance to absorb and manage the daily demands. As the world continues to slow down, we can assess how the moments reflect the delicate balance of who we are. Our days take on a different meaning.

When we focus on the past day and what was, there is a feeling of powerlessness with what we may not have accomplished. We could feel depressed and frustrated. When we focus on too many days ahead, it is a formula for becoming overwhelmed and making decisions with little information or in an untimely manner. Again, frustration and anxiety can occur.



Thoughts of the unknown can bring emotional turmoil and uncertainty of how we will maintain or adapt to what is new. When we live one day at a time, we put energy into knowing that it is God who guides us. We can breathe and reason, and manage our lives in a more orderly fashion. This is the day that the Lord has made for us, and we can choose how we will be within that day and rejoice in it. We can take time to see the blessings and recognize new opportunities in the quietness. We can live intentionally, knowing that our mercies are new each day and that our needs will be met – and this gives hope. We can be a light to others who need hope. We can offer support to those who are depressed or fearful. Our stress lowers when we offer our days ahead to the God who dwells within us and who never leaves us. Leaning into one's faith allows room for building a stronger sense of peace.

This is a time who we are, and knowing that we have been given gifts and talents that can be used – and that gives us purpose. Find that purpose, give it strength one day at a time, and discover a spiritual awakening and divine love that will overpower any real or imagined quarantine we will experience. Remember Jesus' words in scripture: "Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to your life? Since you cannot do this very little thing, why do you worry about the rest? But seek his kingdom, and these things will be given to you as well." (Luke 12)

Take advantage of this unique time away from the daily routine. Glean the wisdom of connecting with your spiritual source in prayer and meditation. See blessings that were previously unseen and know that God's mercies are new each day.



X-Perience Days: Because of our desire to maintain a safe environment for our community and our guests, shadowing will take a different look this year. X-Perience Days will begin at 8:15 a.m. and conclude by 10:30 a.m. Our prospective students will be given a presentation by our Admissions team and then tour the school with a member of our Ambassadors of Xcellence.
