Intermediate and Junior High use a group conference model when they meet with a student's parent/guardian. At this time, we will not be scheduling any OLG~HOME conferences. Thank you





Religious Education

A Saint who Worked Miracles

This past Tuesday, the Church celebrated the memory of a very great saint — Martin de Porres. Martin was born in 1579 in colonial Lima, Peru, to a well-connected white Spanish father and a black mother from Panama who had been a slave. It would be difficult to overemphasize just how much Martin de Porres' Spanish and black origins impacted his life. Even though his father was perfectly well known, Martin's baptism registration reads "Son of an unknown father," making Martin illegal in the eyes of the state and became for him a severe disadvantage. To be half black in colonial Latin America was to start life's race ten miles behind. Catching up to the Spanish-born or to the locally born pure blood Spanish would be impossible. On the ladder of social acceptability in the Spanish colonies, Martin was ranked just above an African slave. After the birth of his sister in 1581, his father abandoned the family. Ana Velázquez supported her children by taking in laundry.



Martin grew up in poverty and, when his mother could not support him, he was sent to a primary school for two years, and then placed with a barber/surgeon to learn the medical arts. Martin learned how to set fractures, dress wounds, and treat infections according to the best practices of his era. And from his mother he learned some unconventional herbal remedies that rounded out his more traditional medical education. He treated the sick and injured regularly and, over time, earned a reputation as an extraordinary healer. He aided in founding a hospital and orphanage in Lima, distributed food to the poor, and cared for recently arrived African slaves.

Many of Martin's nights were spent in prayer and penitential practices; his days were filled with nursing the sick and caring for the poor. It was particularly impressive that he treated all people regardless of their color, race, or status. He was instrumental in founding an orphanage, took care of slaves brought from Africa, and managed the daily alms of the priory with practicality, as well as generosity. His extraordinary charity was his greatest attribute. You need candles? Of course. Blankets? One moment, please. Shoes and a comb? I'll be back. Miracles and cures? Yes, God bless you. Martin de Porres became famous for doing many things—very many things—and doing them all well and with a smile.

In addition to his life of interrupted service, Martin was also a spiritual warrior. He became a Dominican lay brother but never a priest – he didn't feel worthy – but he lived in community and proudly wore the religious habit. He abstained from meat, spent long hours in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament, and was witnessed displaying supernatural gifts. He lifted himself off the ground. He bilocated. His room filled with light. He possessed knowledge he could in no way have possessed naturally. His wide array of natural and supernatural gifts made him famous in Lima. When his life came to an end at the age of sixty, his body was publicly shown, and pieces of his habit were discreetly clipped off as relics.



Martin de Porres was canonized a saint in 1962. He was among the first generation of saints from the New World, along with his contemporary and friend Saint Rose of Lima. Martin was also the first mixed-race saint. He did not enjoy a European education and did not have pure European blood, but Saint Martin proved the Catholic Faith could migrate across the Atlantic Ocean intact. Saint Martin de Porres was a forerunner of many good things to come. One could hardly imagine a more fitting patron of Christian forgiveness and Christian justice on the part of those who are discriminated against - than Martin de Porres, He is the Patron Saint of African Americans, Barbers, Race Relations, and Social Justice.

Prayer: Saint Martin de Porres, we present our humble petitions to you, so that your faith and humility may bring them to our Father in Heaven. You were close to both God and all people on earth. Continue to be close to us as you live with the Lord in heaven and seek favors from Jesus on our behalf. Amen.



"Mindfulness means to pay attention in a particular way - on purpose, in the present moment, and nonjudgmentally." (Jon Kabot-Zinn)

Take some time for you and your child(ren) to turn off the electronics and practice mindfulness. Notice the different shapes and colors in

- ☐ Put on your coat or sweater using your other arm. It may sound strange; however, we usually choose the same arm to put into the sleeve first. Notice what you usually do and reverse it. How did that feel?
- ☐ Take a deep breath! We often say it, but do we do it? Research shows that deep breathing has a positive impact on your brain. Take a moment to start the day by closing your eyes and taking three deep breaths. Encourage your child to use this when they are stressed

- You love your child. Let them know every day this week! Each day write them a message or text...
- TLove You and BELIEVE in you!"
- You are LOVED! Today will be a GREAT day!"
- "Having a bad day? Don't forget I LOVE you!"
- Spread love around like peanut butter. It's a healthy food with substance and it sticks to you!
- Any day can be Valentine's Day. Encourage younger kids to make a card for someone. Suggest to older kids to send a quick text (from your phone or theirs) to a loved one.

- Help your child(ren) exercise their kindness muscle. Think of someone you want to be kind to, and imagine speaking directly to him/her in a kind voice and say, "May you be happy, may you be safe, I wish you well today!"

I am present and fully engaged in the moment.






