

#### May Christ be Born in Our Hearts

Some of you may know, that aside from being a Religious Educator, I have been a music minister for many years assisting at Masses and programs at churches and schools in the Archdiocese. It's a labor of love. Often at Christmas time, I like to volunteer to play music for the kids at Cincinnati Children's Hospital and Ronald McDonald House, as well as at nursing homes. That is when the spirit of Christmas really comes alive for me. It is very worthwhile and I'm glad I still have the opportunity to do it.

As we move into the last week or so before Christmas, I wanted to share with you a story that was told to me by my good friend Tom – who makes his living as a religious entertainer – and one particular Christmas program *he did* at a local nursing home. It always touches my heart.

Before Tom began his thirty-minute Christmas program of storytelling, juggling, and comedy for the residents of the nursing home – he walked through the crowded room. The room had that familiar nursing room smell and was full of the usual suspects – some in wheelchairs, others lying on beds they had rolled into the room, some who just had blank stares on their faces. He shook hands with them all. Most of them had a smile for him except for one resident – an old man – who sat in a wheel chair simply staring off into space. Tom took particular notice of him and made his way through the crowd. He reached down and took the man's yellow, jaundiced hand and shook it and said "hello there!" but the man didn't move and simply stared blankly off into space.

So, Tom walked to the front of the room and began his show. He did some masterful juggling, evoking "ooohs" and "aaahs" from the residents. Not a real magician, he did some funny magic tricks and told a few jokes which the old folks seemed to enjoy – some shouting out the punch lines before Tom could even say them! Everybody was having a great time – but all through the show Tom kept an eye on the man with the yellow jaundiced hands who continued to stare with a fixed blank gaze. As the show came to a close, Tom was ready for his *big finale*. He reached into his large bag and pulled out a very large, gold colored kazoo that was in the shape of a trumpet. Tom mimicked playing a Christmas tune on it and ended with a flamboyant trumpet-like fanfare. Applause broke out and Tom took a deep bow to end the show.



Packing up his things, he made his way to the door - and as he once again walked among some of the remaining folks to say goodbye – a hand reached out and grabbed his arm with a firm and tight grip. Looking down, Tom saw a yellow, jaundiced hand and realized it was the man with the blank stare he had seen earlier. But this time, the old man's eyes weren't blankly staring , but brightly sparkled.

Looking at Tom, he announced boldly: "I USED TO PLAY THE TRUMPET!" "You did?" Tom said with a smile. "YES, SIR!" the old man said proudly, "IN A BIG BAND!" Tom reached in his bag and took out the kazoo and handed it to the man - who ran his fingers over it and Tom could see the man smile as he handed the kazoo-trumpet back to Tom. "Merry Christmas" the man said faintly and vigorously shook Tom's hand. As he began to leave, a nurse suddenly ran up to Tom and said frantically: "Did that man over there *speak* to you?" "Yes," Tom said, "He told me he use to play the trumpet." "Oh my God!" the nurse said – fighting back a tear "He has been here at this nursing home for over six months and has never said a single word to anyone! No one here even thought he could speak!" Tom looked over at the man with the jaundiced hands – and through his own tears, Tom could see the man was still smiling.



For that particular old man, his Christmas gift came in the most unlikely way - by a juggler with a trumpet-kazoo who re-lit happy memories of the wonderful life he had once lived. You could call it a miracle, but Christmas is a time for miracles. After all, it was to a darkened world so many centuries ago that the sound of a trumpet and the voices of angels were heard singing *"Glory to God in the highest – peace on earth – good will to all!"*
