RE-ENROLLMENT DEADLINE: FEBRUARY 11, 2022

To re-enroll go to olgcs.org, click on the "Registration or Re-Enrollment!" box and proceed as directed. A non-refundable deposit of \$50 will be processed through FACTS Management within two business days of re-enrollment. 2021-22 tuition/fees must be current in order to re-enroll for 2022-23.

- (1) Complete the attached 2022-2023 Renewal Form(see below) and attach a recent Electric, Gas, Water, Sewer, Cable/Internet bill. Other Acceptable Documents: Monthly mortgage statement and signed Lease/rental agreement and one (1) other official document with parent's name and address.
- (2) Complete the attached 2022-23 Income Verification Form (see below), and attach either 4 current pay stubs for each job, or your W-2 forms, or your 2021 Federal Income Tax Return forms. Families applying for the Expansion scholarship MUST have their income verified by EdChoice; it is NOT optional. Traditional Scholarship families who qualify under the State's income guidelines will not need to pay the difference between the Traditional EdChoice Scholarship and tuition. Parents/Guardians may now create an OH/ID account and use the EdChoice Income Verification System to enter and submit their income information at https://safe.ode.state.oh.us/portal. You may apply for the needs-based CEF Scholarship at www.catholicbestchoice.org to cover this difference.
- (3) Parents must complete the attached 2022-2023 Request Form for newly enrolled siblings of current students.

NOTE: The State will not process incomplete forms or forms without the required documents.

I Want to See!

Then Jesus stopped and ordered that the blind man be brought to him. When came near, Jesus asked him: "What do you want me to do for you?" The blind man replied: "Lord, please let me see." Jesus told him: "Have sight; your faith has saved you."

Now what is the former blind man going to do? He has no job skills. He has no work history. He can't read. The only thing he's ever known was sitting around collecting disability. He's learned to live off the system. Now what? Who's going to hire this guy? Minutes before he was sitting along the side of the road in his familiar spot blind and begging. Now, he can miraculously see.

You have to hand it to him, he was good at begging. Even though he couldn't see, he knew how to get people's attention. Nothing was wrong with his lungs. According to the Bible text he could be loud and irritating. He must have learned that persistence pays off. He got Jesus' attention with his technique.



Jesus is walking along with His normal group of followers. The blind beggar starts into his routine. The entourage's crowd control team, couldn't quiet the man. He just got louder and more obnoxious. Now Jesus is used to people pressing Him and shouting at Him. But this guy is so pushy that Jesus finally stops and asks the man, what he wants. The request was simple by the blind beggar. *I want to see*.

Had he really thought this through? If he gets his sight back, he can't sit along the road anymore and beg. He'll be thrust into the work force with no background experience. Had he considered that? If Jesus does give him his sight, things are really going to have to change.

And just as requested, Jesus gave the man sight instantly. "Your faith has saved you," Jesus said. Okay, his faith healed him. But will his faith get him a job, a place to live, put food on the table? He can't go back to the old way of life. He's made such a big deal about his healing that everyone knows he's not blind anymore. He's got to step up to the plate. No more sympathy. No more begging.

What's my point? It takes faith to be healed. But it takes even greater faith to go forward *from* the healing. People cry out to God for healing, to be saved, and sincerely believe God can do that for them. The problem comes with what do I do now that I'm saved, now that I've been delivered. A lot of people want to grab the sunglasses and cup and go back to the roadside. Nope – you can't go there. Not if you truly want to be healed.

The point of healing is to make your life better. You have to move on into a world that you've never experienced. You get your sight, now you're expected to go to work. If you weren't planning on going forward, why ask for healing? Healing demands a new direction and higher expectations. God loves us just as we are. But once He's touches our lives, He doesn't expect us to stay that way. He wants us to grow and develop and become productive in the Kingdom of God.

The story of the blind man is often held up as one of the great healing miracles of Jesus. In the gospels Jesus transforms the lives of those on the margins and draws them more and more into the center. But what if we saw this story as the crowd, the followers of Jesus, being blind *and not the beggar on the road?* The crowd in our gospel saw this blind beggar as annoyance, disturbing Jesus as he preached God's kingdom. He was a disturbance, a distraction from the 'way things are done', but Jesus skillfully moves him from the sidelines, recognizes his humanity and dignity and draws him closer to the center. The blind man wasn't blind where it really mattered because he had a perfect vision of what it meant to be a beloved child of God. Not only did he know that he was a beloved child of God he insisted on being treated like a beloved child of God. Not even the crowd could hold him back. The passage above from the Gospel is followed by this line: *"The blind man immediately received his sight and followed Jesus, giving glory to God. When they saw this, all the people gave praise to God."* Amen!

God, following you isn't easy. As you bring deliverance to us, you create new opportunities and challenges for us. I need to be challenged to grow. I need you constantly moving me forward. I want my faith not only to make me well, but to help me grow as a person being formed into the image of your son. Mark Friedman, CRE

K-2 Instructional Basketball: K-2 Instructional Basketball sign ups are open! Boys and Girls who attend OLG, or belong to one of the covenant parishes (Assumption, St. Margaret Mary, Little Flower, St. Ann), and are in grades Kindergarten - 2nd grade can register to play instructional basketball. The season runs from mid-February through the end of March.

Sessions are one night a week, on Sunday's, for 1-hour. The sessions are typically split into two halves, where student athletes will focus on learning fundamental skills (dribbling, passing, shooting drills) and then participate in small scrimmage (providing there are enough participants).

WHAT is Girls on the Run?

Girls on the Run is a program that gives girls the opportunity to build confidence and healthy habits. You'll learn how to make great friendships, how to celebrate all that makes you unique, and so much more! Each week, you will also take part in training and activities that will help build endurance for a celebratory 5k running event.

WHO can join? 3rd, 4th and 5th grade girls like YOU!

WHEN do we meet? Twice a week after school for 75-90 minutes with your team. The program is held at the school and is led by trained, volunteer coaches.
