Religious Education

May the Force be with You

Ok, I admit it, I'm a Star Wars fan. And I'm excited because the new movie *The Last Jedi* opens on December 15 (yes I even know the date). Since the first movie in 1977, the irresistible force of the *Star Wars* phenomenon has affected young and old alike. It's nearly impossible to get through a day without being bombarded by a *Star Wars* image or advertisement for the new movie! After all, Steven Spielberg predicted way back at the time of the first movie that it would be "the biggest movie ever." So why do so many across generations, cultures, and religions find *Star Wars* so captivating? Is it the dynamic characters, the spectacular musical score, the breathtaking special effects? Sure, all these contribute to the magic of *Star Wars*. But I don't think any of those can explain the mystery that has sparked wonder in millions for almost 40 years. Let's look at it.

The *Star Wars* saga has many universal themes: fall and corruption, struggle and conflict, sacrifice and redemption, heroism and hope. George Lucas, the creator of *Star Wars*, pulled deeply from the wells of human experience and incorporated themes that have repeatedly appeared in epic poems, plays, legends, myths, and religious beliefs of various cultures throughout history. In fact, Lucas hacked into a "formula" storytellers often call "the hero's journey" by using universal human experiences:

frustration with the present world and our own lives; thinking there may be a greater purpose and meaning to life; the conflict between good and evil; the belief that this world isn't the way it's supposed to be; the hope that things will one day be better than they are; the urge to give up everything and get involved in the struggle. Though everything in the *Star Wars* universe is fiction, the saga touches on something real and paints pictures of profound spiritual truths that all humans *feel* but few can put into words.

In the mythical *Star Wars* universe, the "good side of the Force" serves as a metaphor for an invisible and powerful source of goodness, truth, and life. According to *Star Wars* lore, somehow an imbalance occurred in the universe with the coming of the dark side, bringing evil, falsehood, and death. *Star Wars* uses these metaphors of light versus dark to restore "balance" to the Force. Characters like Luke Skywalker and Darth Vader play out their personal struggles with temptation, fall, conflict, and redemption within the ancient battle between good and evil - Empire versus Rebels, Jedi versus Sith. And in the *Star Wars* universe, balance isn't achieved by equalizing the dark side and the light, but by crushing the dark side entirely - the victory of the light brings true order. The images of darkness and light also characterize our Christian story of creation, fall, and redemption. God first dispelled darkness with light (Gen. 1:1-3). He then crowned his newly ordered creation with human beings—his personal agents of glory and goodness – yet some chose darkness and evil.



At just the right time, God sent his light into the world to drive out the darkness (John 1:4, 9). God's Son battled the forces of darkness (John 1:5), surrendered his life to save the world (John 3:16), and rose from the dead in victory over death (Acts 2:24). And until his return, we - the children of light (1 Thess. 5:5) - are to serve as God's force of light and truth against the agents of darkness (Eph. 6:12). This brings *a new hope* to fallen world, and helping us focus on a time yet to come when death itself will be swallowed up by life eternal (1 Cor. 15:54-56).

Of course, it could be merely a coincidence that the fictional story of *Star Wars* shares some similarities with the Bible. But there's another explanation. Imagine truth as pure light through every aspect of God's created universe, but allowed to be told through human image-bearers whose imaginations tell stories that captivate us. The *Star Wars* writers tell the ultimate story imprecisely, imperfectly, and often impurely, but almost always the big-picture themes remain: fall, struggle, sacrifice, hope, forgiveness, redemption, reconciliation, and triumph. In the end, through a catastrophic conflict between good and evil, the dark side is crushed and the light is victorious. All these themes become illustrations of God's story of redemption. All serve as potential points of contact between the tellers of God's story and a world entranced by the magical world of *Star Wars*.

Enjoy the Movie – I certainly will! *And may the force be with you!*

BOOKOPOLY

Again this year, students in grades 4-8 have been challenged to read 40 books in different genres. New this year is the theme, Bookopoly. There are 40 squares on a Monopoly board, one for each book. The different property groups are the different genres. Instead of buying the properties when they read and record a book, they earn value of the property. **Students can use this monopoly money to purchase items in our Bookopoly Store.**



The primary reason for this program is to encourage all kids to read more and to stretch our young readers to explore new types of books and genres of literature. It is also a fun way to track and reward reading that they have to do anyway.



All students have received information about this program in library class. They can access their Bookopoly Record in Google Classroom or Google Drive from any computer at school or home.

Any book read during this school year counts. Books from over the summer do not count for this program. Books can be AR or not, it doesn't matter. Books must be at the student's level. All books must be recorded on their Bookopoly Record to count towards their money total.



Bookopoly Store will be open December 18-19 and then again in the spring, TBD.
