Mr. Bisenius has twenty years of experience as a child and adolescent therapist specializing in teaching extremely targeted students how to handle bullying situations. He has developed response techniques which have been nationally recognized as highly effective at stopping the dance between kids who bully and the ones they target. Jim has taught his methods to over 950 schools nationally. All of these trainings were promoted school to school strictly through word of mouth.

Mr. Bisenius earned his Bachelor's Degree from Miami University, and his Master's Degree from Ohio State University. He has received a "Child Advocate of the Year" award, as well as a "Violence Prevention Award".

LENT - WHAT TO DO?

The season of Lent is here. As always, we ask ourselves *what will we do this year?* As I thought about this, I came across an online post about a recent papal audience that Pope Francis held at the Vatican. According to a Catholic online publication, a beautiful little girl with Down Syndrome got up from her seat during the audience and ran up towards Pope Francis. The security guards quickly moved in to take her back to her mother. But, the Pope stopped everyone and said to the little girl, "come – and sit next to me." The girl then sat down on his chair and the Holy Father continued to preach while holding hands with the little girl.



The Pope has shown so often during his Papacy that "kindness" is at the heart of the Gospel. For example, he spoke out against frivolous spending in the Church. The average set of cardinal's clothes costs as much as \$20,000. In October, Pope Francis urged officials to dress more modestly and to not squander such money. In the same month, he ordered a German bishop to explain how he had spent \$3 million on a marble courtyard.

During Lent last year, Francis held a major Holy Week service at Casal del Marmo jail for youth, rather than the Vatican. During the service, the pope washed and kissed the feet of 12 young offenders to commemorate Jesus' gesture of humility towards his apostles on the night before he died. During the service, he broke tradition by washing the feet of women and Muslims.

What great examples! Perhaps *kindness* should be my Lenten resolution this year! **The following is from Pope Francis 2018 Lenten Message:**

"By devoting more time to *prayer*, we enable our hearts to root out our secret lies and forms of self-deception, and then to find the consolation God offers. He is our Father and he wants us to live life well.

Almsgiving sets us free from greed and helps us to regard our neighbor as a brother or sister. What I possess is never mine alone. I would like almsgiving to become a genuine style of life for each of us! How I would like us, as Christians, to follow the example of the Apostles and see in the sharing of our possessions a tangible witness of the communion that is ours in the Church! This is all the more fitting during the Lenten season, when many groups take up collections to assist Churches and peoples in need. Yet I would also hope that, even in our daily encounters with those who beg for our assistance, we would see such requests as coming from God himself. When we give alms, we share in God's



providential care for each of his children. If through me God helps someone today, will he not tomorrow provide for my own needs? For no one is more generous than God.

Fasting weakens our tendency to violence; it disarms us and becomes an important opportunity for growth. On the one hand, it allows us to experience what the destitute and the starving have to endure. On the other hand, it expresses our own spiritual hunger and thirst for life in God. Fasting wakes us up. It makes us more attentive to God and our neighbor. It revives our desire to obey God, who alone is capable of satisfying our hunger.

Above all, I urge the members of the Church to take up the Lenten journey with enthusiasm, sustained by almsgiving, fasting and prayer. If, at times, the flame of charity seems to die in our own hearts, know that this is never the case in the heart of God! He constantly gives us a chance to begin loving anew. With affection and the promise of my prayers for all of you, I send you my blessing. Please do not forget to pray for me." *Blessings, Mark Friedman, CRE*
