What's in a Name?

As we find ourselves at the end of the school year, I thought it would be appropriate – in this last article before Summer vacation - to say a few words about the title of Mary that we have chosen as the name of our school -Our Lody of Grace.

Sometimes Non-Catholics will confront me about the importance our Catholic Church places on Mary – often saying to me that don't like how Catholics worship Mary and place her above Jesus. *My answer is no!* Mary is not more important than Jesus. But Mary does make me appreciate the *grace* — the gift from God — that it takes to say "yes," not once, but over and over and *over*, as I move through my life and the challenges I face. It is in Mary's motherhood, in her humanity, in her constant pointing back to her Son, that I find encouragement to go on despite hardships.

It is Mary who has made me think of God in more intimate terms: as a Daddy instead of as a cold, distant deity. How can I keep Jesus at arms' length when I know He was once a baby, a toddler, a preteen, a teen, a young adult? There's no doubt that He was *human*, and when I think of Mary, I think of Jesus' *humanity*, of the experience He and I share, however weak it may seem at first. In bringing God closer to me, in becoming more intimate with Him, I find grace less elusive and more concrete: I find friendship with God.

The little statue I have had for years of Our Lady of Grace (isn't it interested I now work at a school of the same name?) has always seemed from year to year to move around my house. Sometimes Mary is a part of the frames on the top of the piano in the front hall, where she observed my children when they were growing up and greeted us when we come home. Other times, Mary has stood in the kitchen, reminding us that what we're doing is not drudgery, but keeping the heart of our home beating. Currently, Mary has moved into the living room, where we relax in the evenings, so that I can remember to keep God in all parts of my day, not just in the mornings when I'm feeling fresh and energetic.

This little statue, which I didn't recognize as an Our Lady of Grace statue until recently, is standing with her arms out. It's a title of Mary that has been in use since at least medieval times. More recently, it is linked with a vision of Mary to Saint Catherine Laboure in 1830. She was standing on a globe, dressed in white with a long white veil reaching to her feet. Mary's hands were extended, at the height of her shoulders, holding a golden ball heavenward, and looking the same direction. On her fingers, she wore rings with precious jewels. Some of the jewels sparkled and showered rays of light on the globe beneath her. Saint Catherine heard this message: "These rays symbolize the graces I shed upon those who ask for them. The jewels which give no rays symbolize the graces that are not given because they are not asked for."

There are no rays and no rings on my little statue of Our Lady of Grace. It has always looked to me like she would hug me if I could just shrink in size. And maybe, in the end, that's what grace is: a hug from God, something we can't see, but that we can feel and know. Maybe I feel like the hug — the grace — comes from Mary, but she is the channel, the way that God relates to me where I am. Here at school the teachers and staff at the place called our Lady of Grace — pass on to the precious children who walk through these halls an opportunity to receive those graces - those hugs from God — each and every day.

As Our Lady of Grace, Mary reaches out her arms to each of us, ready to cradle us just as she cradled her very human infant Jesus. She will calm us when we're losing our minds with worry, frustration, or confusion, just as she must have calmed her Son when He was a toddler. She will show us reason by pointing us toward heaven, even as she introduced the 12-year-old Jesus to the scholars and doctors at the synagogue in Jerusalem. She will cheer us on and pray for us, whether we're bearing a cross that's too heavy or battling demons of addiction and sin, exactly as she watched with sorrowful eyes as her Son carried His cross and was crucified. And when we achieve that victory, however small it may seem, she will smile at us and point us to the Resurrection, the ultimate victory. Mary's intercession to God, in her role as Our Lady of Grace, helps us to obtain the grace we need — to make it through each and every day. 
