
Religious Education

Good Pope John

Today is the Feast Day of Saint John XXIII, "Good Pope John," a dearly loved Pope who reigned only four and a half years -from 1958-1963. Initially, the 78 year old Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli, who took the name John to honor his father, was expected only to be an interim Pope, basically filling time until a younger Pope could be ready and elected. But Pope John surprised everyone by calling for and opening the Second Vatican Council – which changed the Catholic Church in profound and extraordinary ways.

Vatican II had the effect of "throwing open the windows" of the church to let in new and fresh air. The Council sought to open our windows, doors, and eyes to the work of the Holy Spirit moving in our midst. Pope Saint John asked that the church open itself to the working of the Holy Spirit in our own times, and looking back at the Church's history to discover what our present and future might hold for us. Meeting in four sessions (1962-1965) the members, over 2,000 Bishops, and many non-voting observers and specialists, put new emphasis on the Church; the liturgy; lay ministers; other faith communities, and how the Church should look at the world around it.

In today's readings from scripture we hear: "Ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and it will be opened to you." This describes the work that Pope John brought to light through Vatican II. The kind of prayer St. Luke's gospel points to in today's readings is



that we be faithful to personal prayer. We are to "persistently knock" and ask God for the gifts that he desires to give us as individuals and as a Church.

The Church has much these days to bring to the attention of God in prayer – much healing - and each of us is invited to seek diligently the Holy Spirit of God. From God's perspective we are the *apple of his eye* who, as a good father, desires more for us than we can even imagine. What an incredibly refreshing thought!

Although few people had as great an impact on the 20th century as Pope John XXIII, he avoided the limelight as much as possible. Often he would simply put on the black cassock of a parish priest and, much to the concern of the Swiss Guards, would leave the Vatican secretly and walk among the people, visit hospitals and prisons, or have a simple dinner with an ordinary family. Indeed, one writer has noted that his "ordinariness" seems one of his most remarkable qualities.

"Good Pope John" died on June 3, 1963. Saint John Paul II beatified him in 2000, and Pope Francis canonized him in 2014. On his deathbed, Pope John said: "It is not that the gospel has changed; it is that we have begun to understand it better. Those who have lived as long as I have were enabled to compare different cultures and traditions, and know that the moment has come to discern the signs of the times, to seize the opportunity and to look far ahead." We celebrate his feat day not on the day of his death – as it is with most saints – but on October 11 – the day the Second Vatican Council Opened.

So let us pray: God of us all, keep us faithful to your word and your desires for us. Be with us as we negotiate difficulties and send us your Holy Spirit as our guide for prayer and actions in your service. Watch over us with your gentle care that produces both challenge and joy; thank you for the eyes of faith, hope and love. Amen.
