Why Statues?

I have often been asked by people who visit our churches, "Why do Catholics worship idols?" The answer is "we do not" but we do have a long tradition of using statues in our churches. This is because hundreds of years ago, people were not well educated and most could not read and write and couldn't understand the stories in the bible for themselves. Priests and scholars were the only people in the church who were educated enough to read and understand the bible. Therefore, the church used statues, paintings and stained glass windows to visually portray the biblical stories and show what people from that time period may have looked like. The stained glass windows in a church often depicted the stories from Jesus' life visually, so that everyone, including little children, could understand who Jesus was.

It isn't much different today. We have photographs of our grandparents to remember them by, and share stories about who they were, with our children. Music and You Tube videos on the internet tell a story in a couple of minutes, mostly by using pictures and a few words too. People do not have time to read very much and the message needs to get across to the viewer as quickly, and to the point as possible. The images and sound bites on the evening news are other examples of the need to quickly portray a story in just a few seconds.

Many of the buildings in our nation's capital have statues of presidents, war heroes, and other important public figures in order to honor them and preserve their memory. There are a lot of town squares throughout the world that have statues of a famous person who once lived in their town too, to honor them and remember what they looked like. Jesus, Mary and the saints are no different than any other important public figures in our world today. Catholics have statues of Jesus, Mary and the saints in our churches, to honor them and preserve their memory, just like our nation does with statues of presidents and war heroes.

Just a Note: May Crowning, the Rosary, and the many statues of Mary to the casual observer may appear that Catholics are worshiping Mary - not true - this is simply a way that Catholics show her honor. God honored Mary too, by sending the angel Gabriel to tell her she was "full of grace" and ask her to bear his son.

Here at the Our Lady of Grace Catholic School, we have many beautiful statues of Mary and the saints all around the building and Saint Ann Church. Below are just a few of the many statues which *honor* these wonderful saints and preserve their memory. (there are more) Remember the expression, "out of sight, out of mind?" As Catholics, we never want Jesus, and Mary, and the example of the saints to be out of sight or out of mind, but be forever enduring in our hearts, and in our everyday lives. *See if you can find these statues around the building!*

We will be celebrating the last day of school with an all school Mass at 10:30. After Mass, we will honor our retirees, and sing the Circle Song. Parents are invited to share in this celebration with us.

We will then go back to the classrooms for final summer preparations. At 12:15, you are invited to sign your child(ren) out from their homerooms for our family picnic out on the field. **You are welcome to take your child(ren) home after lunch**. (If it rains, the picnic will be held inside.)

The cafeteria will have a brown bag style lunch and milk available for students to purchase or students can pack their own lunch from home. Adults/family members can bring their own lunches to enjoy with the students.

We understand not all parents are able to attend our picnic, so teachers will have lunch with students whose parents are unable to attend. They will supervise them until dismissal at 2:50 p.m. Buses will be running at their normal times for those students.

Meal Accounts as the School Year Wraps Up

- Meal Money Will Carry Over- Any money on your child's lunch account at the end of the year will automatically carry over to next school year.
- Graduating 8th Graders Accounts- Money left in 8th grade accounts will be automatically transferred to a younger sibling in the same household. If there is no sibling, the cafeteria staff will be contacting 8th grade parents as graduation approaches to make arrangements for a refund or to donate remaining funds to a younger student.
- Students Who Are Not Returning Next Year- Please contact the school cafeteria before
 the last week of school to arrange for a refund of any remaining money. Refunds will be
 made during the last week of school.
- K-12 Payment System Closes for Summer- During the summer, K-12 Payment Accounts
 cannot be viewed or money added to accounts until the next school year approaches.
 The K-12 Payment System utilizes the summer break to update their website and
 features.







Why We Support Pediatric Brain Cancer Research

PHBF has chosen to focus efforts upon pediatric brain tumors because brain tumors are the deadliest type of cancer in children. Some types of brain tumors have survival rates lower than 20 percent. Each year, there are 4,200 more diagnoses of brain tumors in children; 72% of these children are younger than 15. Diagnosing and treating brain tumors are extremely difficult because there are 130 different types of brain tumors. Brain tumors in children are different than brain tumors in adults so specific research into pediatric brain tumors is needed. While survival rates for children with brain tumors have improved greatly in the past 30 years, most survivors experience lifelong side effects from treatment including physical, learning and emotional difficulties.
