

Let's Not Forget...

Seventeen years ago this week the worst terrorist attack in U.S. history turned more than a few ordinary Americans into heroes. Nearly 3,000 people lost their lives on Sep. 11, 2001 but there are some who went above and beyond in trying to save lives, and ultimately prevented this tragedy from becoming an even worse one. Here's one hero story.



Rick Rescorla was already a hero of the battlefields of Vietnam, where he earned the Silver Star and other awards for bravery as an Army officer. Rescorla would often sing to his men to calm them down while under heavy enemy fire, using songs he remembered while growing up and patriotic songs. That day, on Sep. 11 in the South Tower, many more would hear his songs where Rescorla was working as head of corporate security for the Morgan Stanley Company. When American Airlines Flight 11 hit the tower next to him, The New York City Port Authority ordered Rescorla to tell his employees to stay put and remain at their desks.

"Rick called his friend Daniel Hill "Are you watching this on TV? There's no way we're just sitting here! Everything above where that plane hit is going to collapse, and it's going to take the whole building with it. I'm getting my people out of here." Rescorla, who had frequently warned the Port Authority and his company about the World Trade Center's security weaknesses, defied their order and issued his own order to evacuate. He had made Morgan Stanley employees practice emergency drills for years, and it paid off that day: Just 16 minutes after the first plane hit the opposite tower.

"Greater Love Hath No Man"

Wasting no time, Rick grabbed his bullhorn, walkie-talkie, and cell phone, and began systematically ordering Morgan Stanley employees and any others there to evacuate, including the 1,000 employees over in WTC Building 5. He directed people down a stairwell from the 44th floor, continuing to calm employees after the building lurched violently following the crash of United Airlines Flight 175 - 38 floors above into Tower 2 at 9:03 A.M. Morgan Stanley executive Bill McMahon stated that even a group of 250 people visiting the offices for a stockbroker training class knew what to do because they had been shown the nearest stairway. During the evacuation, Rescorla calmly reassured people, leading them

in singing "God Bless America" over the bullhorn he carried as they walked down the stairs. During the evacuation Rescorla called his wife, and said: "Stop crying, I have to get these people out safely. If something should happen to me, I want you to know that I've never been happier. You made my life." Once the people were out of danger, incredibly fearless and courageous, Rescorla re-entered the burning South Tower of the World Trade Center to be sure that all of the Morgan Stanley employees and anyone else who was up there had safely left the building. He believed there were a few who still needed help. A soldier to the end, he would never leave anyone behind, even if it meant sacrificing his own life. Rick Rescorla was last seen on the 10th floor of the South Tower, heading upward to look for any stragglers. His body was never found.
