

Religious Education

We are God's Chosen Race – His Saints...

On Nov. 4, Sister Rani Maria will be beatified – the last step toward sainthood. As a member of the Franciscan Clarist Congregation, she worked among the poor and marginalized in Central India. Her work of educating the poor about their rights brought her into conflict with landlords and money-lenders. On February 25, 1995, Samundar Singh - a hitman - stabbed her multiple times while she travelled to church in a public bus. Most of the passengers ran away in fear; none came to her rescue. She died on the road.

Our story does not end here. Samundar Singh was convicted of murder and sentenced to life imprisonment. Sister Rani Maria's family members, however, visited him in prison. Her mother kissed his hands as a sign of forgiveness. Sister Selmy (younger sister of Rani Maria and a member of the same congregation) tied a "rakhi," or sacred thread, on the hand of Samundar, signifying that he was her brother. Samundar repented and was released in 2006.

I share this story of Sr. Rani Maria with you as we celebrate this week The Feast of All Saints - all the holy women and men who are now in heaven. Like this brave nun, there are many people from different times and places who have given witness by their faith, courage, love, forgiveness, humility, or commitment, among other virtues. Some of them have been canonized saints, others have joined the communion of saints by being who they were or by doing the best that they could — cooking in kitchens for their families, filing papers in crowded offices, teaching naughty children in classrooms, or by tilling the fields under the hot sun. Yes, as today's Gospel explains, they are "blessed" for they lived and loved unselfishly. The Beatitudes describe the saints — they refused to conform to the values of the world, to live self-centered lives. Rather, they were sensitive to the needs of their neighbors.



They chose to be meek rather than arrogant, to live with a poverty of spirit rather than with inflated egos, to work for what is right, and to live with pure and sincere hearts. People may have laughed at them, but the saints got their reward: "theirs is the Kingdom of Heaven."

The readings for All Saints Mass invite us to reflect: one day we will join these saints who have gone before us. Yes, we remember that God wants all of us to be saved. The passage we listen to in the first reading from the Book of Revelations was written to provide strength and comfort to the early Christians persecuted by Nero. The great multitude stands before God; they survived the time of great distress and they are washed in the "Blood of the Lamb." We are invited to stand firm and live lives of faith that are just. The second reading reminds us of God's amazing love for each one of us and provides us with hope: one day, like Sister Rani Maria, our grandparents, and all the saints, we will meet God face to face. *Now, isn't that a wonderful promise?*

Talking with Kids about Conflict Resolution

Conflict is a normal, and even healthy, part of relationships. After all, two people can't be expected to agree on everything at all times. Since relationship conflicts are inevitable, learning to deal with them in a healthy way is crucial. When conflict is mismanaged, it can harm the relationship. But when handled in a respectful and positive way, conflict provides an opportunity for growth, ultimately strengthening the bond between two people. The following chart can be helpful for parents when speaking to their child about positive conflict resolution in their lives.

5 of the Best Conflict Resolution Skills THAT KIDS NEED

1. JUST LISTEN

Don't try to fix it immediately. Instead, let kids use their words to process.

BENEFIT: It helps them feel understood, dissipating frustration.



2. PROBLEM SOLVE

Encourage your child to brainstorm ways to solve her problem.

BENEFIT: It gives kids confidence for solving future conflicts.



3. ASK QUESTIONS

Prompt your child with questions to help him think through the what if scenarios.

BENEFIT: It helps kids learn the conflict resolution process, a valuable grown-up skill.



4. LET KIDS WORK IT OUT

Give your child the opportunity to work it out himself without stepping in immediately. (As long as there's no immediate danger.)

BENEFIT: It fosters self-confidence and independence!



5. HELP THEM THROUGH IT

If your child reaches an impasse, sometimes it's okay not to step in and fix it. Disappointment happens sometimes.

BENEFIT: Learning these lessons slowly under your loving supervision is better than facing young adulthood underprepared.


