#### Inclement Weather

OLG will not announce an early dismissal for snow. No students will be released to district transportation operating on an early dismissal for fear there will be no supervision at home when they arrive.



If you believe your child will need to use the YMCA Before and After Care at any point this year (regular school days, delays and/or closings), you will need to fill out the registration form and return it to the YMCA program in the gym or the office at the Clippard YMCA. This can take a couple days



#### Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton

Today is the feast day of St. Elizabeth Ann Bayley Seton was the first native born American to be canonized by the Catholic Church. A true daughter of the American Revolution, she was born on August 28, 1774, just two years before the Declaration of Independence was signed. Elizabeth grew up in the upper class of New York society. Reared a staunch Episcopalian, she learned the value of prayer. Her father, Dr. Richard Bayley, did not have much use for churches but was a great humanitarian, teaching his daughter to love and serve others.

In 1794, Elizabeth married the wealthy young William Seton, with whom she was deeply in love and they had five children. The first years of their marriage were happy and prosperous and Elizabeth became the Belle of New York Society. Elizabeth wrote in her diary, "My own home at twenty! The world, that, and heaven too! It all seems quite impossible." This time of Elizabeth's life was to be a brief moment of earthly happiness before the many deaths and partings she was to suffer. Within four years, William's father died, leaving the young couple in charge of William's seven half brothers and sisters, as well as the family's shipping and importing business.



Events moved quickly from there with devastating effect. Both William's business and health failed. He was finally forced into bankruptcy. In a final attempt to save William's health, the Seton family sailed for Italy where William had business friends, seeking a cure. Unfortunately, William died of tuberculosis while in Italy. The many enforced separations from dear ones by death and distance served to draw Elizabeth's heart to God and eternity. The accepting and embracing of God's will would be a keynote in her spiritual life. In Italy, Elizabeth captivated everyone by her kindness, patience, good sense, wit, and courtesy. During this time Elizabeth became interested in the Catholic Faith and her Italian friends guided her in Catholic instruction. Elizabeth's desire for the Holy Eucharist was to be a strong force in her life.

Having lost her mother at an early age, Elizabeth felt great comfort in the idea that the Blessed Virgin Mary was truly her mother, and officially joined the Catholic Church in 1805. Moving back to New York City, many of her family and friends rejected her because of her newfound faith – and New York society shunned her. Forced to leave, Elizabeth moved to Baltimore and started a successful school there. Seton, and two other young women who helped her in her work, began plans for a start a Sisterhood. They established the first free Catholic school in America. When the young community – The Sisters of Charity - adopted their rule in 1812, Elizabeth made sure there was a provision for her to continue raising her own children.

By 1818, in addition to their first school, the sisters had established two orphanages and another school. Today, six groups of sisters can trace their origins to Mother Seton's initial foundation. The thousand or more letters of Mother Seton reveal the development of her spiritual life from ordinary goodness to heroic sanctity.

Elizabeth Seton suffered great trials of sickness, persecution, misunderstanding, the death of loved ones (her husband and two of her young daughters) and the heartache of a wayward son. She died January 4, 1821, and became the first American-born citizen to be beatified (by Pope John XXIII on March 17, 1963) and was canonized on September 14, 1975 by Pope Paul VI – the first American Saint! She is buried in Emmetsburg, Maryland and is the Patron Saint of Catholic Schools.


# La Salle Drama Presents Willy Wonka Jr.
