How Can We Know the Way?

Do not let your hearts be troubled. You believe in God, so also believe in me. In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me. You know the way to the place where I am going. And Thomas said to him, "Lord, we don't know where you are going, so how can we know the way?" Jesus answered "I am the way and the truth and the life." - John 14

Whenever I read this Gospel passage, I recall a boy that I ministered to many years ago when I was a hospital chaplain. He was a leukemia patient back in the days when that disease was a death sentence. Both his parents would not allow talk of death around their son. They hushed him whenever he broached the subject. Perhaps they thought that if they didn't talk about death they could keep it away.

One morning while I was visiting him, he spoke about a dream he had had the night before. "Jesus came to me and talked to me in my sleep last night," he said. "Really?" I said. "What did he say to you?" The boy said "Jesus told me he is building me a house and it is nearly finished." The boy died two weeks later.

It amazes me that we can hear certain passages from the gospels and not gasp. This is one of those. Earlier in that passage we hear the amazing response that Jesus gives to the Apostle Philip's request that Jesus show the disciples the Father "and that will be enough for us." "Philip, whoever has seen me has seen the Father."

Jesus' works are the Father's works. By their works you will know them, we say. But what happens if we take the words one step farther and apply them to our own relationship with Jesus. We are one with Christ. Christ lives in us as we live in Christ. I have even heard it said that God has the same love for us that God has for Christ. If that is so, then think about the implications. Have you ever thought that you might be the only Christ some people will ever meet? If Jesus says to Philip, "Whoever has seen me has seen the Father," does not Jesus want us, as his disciples, to live the reality of our Christianity and so be able to say, "Those who have seen me have seen Jesus?" By their works you shall know them.

The letters on those plastic bracelets may have become a cliché, but the fact is, asking one's self often "what would Jesus do" is not such a bad idea. Why? Because the answer to that question will always be the same - whatever love demands.

Thomas says to the Lord in the Gospel today, "Lord, we don't know where you are going, so how can we know the way?" And what is Jesus' answer? "I am the way and the truth and the life.

Jesus is the answer - and what Jesus would do, ought to be what those who believe in Jesus should choose to do. As hard as the task must seem, the challenge Jesus gives is for those who believe in him to be able to say as a result of the works they do: those who see me, see Jesus. Of course doing those works may make you vulnerable. You just might wind up the way Jesus did, misunderstood, on the cross, with only God as your sole support. All this, and union with God here and here after.

My young friend told me that Jesus was building him a house that was nearly finished. I believe that that young boy came to realize - as he finally entered that house - that he, himself, had built the house. He built it in union with Jesus through his acceptance of his own Cross - and through his firm confidence in the one who is the way, the truth, and the life.




